- Instantly send crime alerts or missing person notices
- Obtaining anonymous tips on specific crimes
- Reporting registered sex offenders
- Announce recent burglaries and illegal scams
- Notify of severe weather alerts
- Report recently resolved crimes
- Invite citizens to CrimeWatch meetings

Citizens can go to www.crimeweb.net and register FREE OF CHARGE. Once registered they will receive notifications on major crimes and public safety by both email and text messaging.
